IF YOUR FAMILY CHOOSES REMOTE SERVICE DELIVERY

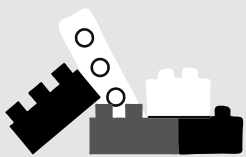
Your Developmental Interventionists will continue to provide services to support your child and family through video or phone consultation. Our four core services of **child development support, family support and capacity building, case coordination and transition support** will continue to be provided.

IF YOUR FAMILY CHOOSES IN-PERSON VISITS

Your Developmental Interventionist will review and ask you sign a document called an "**Informed Consent**". This document explains how we will protect the safety of your family during our visits and how you will protect the safety of our Developmental Interventionist. Your in-person visits will continue to include our four core services as listed above.

OUR FAMILY TOY & RESOURCE LIBRARIES

Our Family Toy & Resource libraries have re-opened and items are available for loan by all NSECDis families (whether you are receiving services remotely or in person).

Toys, resources and programming materials can be dropped off to families (while practicing social distancing) or can be brought out during home visits. Strict cleaning protocols will be followed by NSECDis staff to ensure your family's safety.

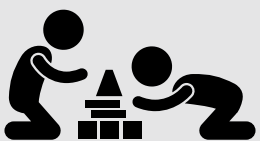

KEEPING EVERYONE SAFE

Your Developmental Interventionist will only carry out visits when they are symptom free. Prior to each in-person visit, your Developmental Interventionist will complete a short COVID 19 questionnaire with you to check on the health of your family.

Your Developmental Interventionist will use hand sanitizer when they enter and exit your home and will be wearing a mask at all times. We ask that the adults present during the visit also wear masks.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATIONS

Your Developmental Interventionist is also available to provide consultation to your child's community programs such as child care programs, pre-primary programs and schools. Your Developmental Interventionist will be following outreach visit protocols to ensure their safety and the safety of the programs they are visiting.
